Lewis Carroll

Lewis Carroll's real name was Charles Lutwidge Dodgson. He was born on 27 January 1832 in Daresbury in Cheshire, England. He was the third son of a pastor.

When he was a child he loved creating puppet^① shows. He was also fond of logic and mathematic games.

In 1851, he went to Oxford University. A few years later, he got his diploma in mathematics and became a teacher. He taught at the university and also took religious classes. He became a deacon^② in 1861.

He worked on mathematics and, at the same time, published short stories in a magazine called *The Train*, under the pen name Lewis Carroll. In 1865, he published his most famous novel *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* and soon became a famous writer. Then in 1871, he published its sequel *Through the Looking Glass*.

Alice's Adventures in Wonderland was written for a little girl who liked listening to his stories very much. Her name was Alice Liddell, she was one of his friends' daughter.

At first, his stories were for kids, but adults got interested in them too. They liked to find hidden messages in them. His stories are full of absurdity, nonsense and fantasia.

Lewis Carroll was also a photographer. He took plenty of photos of little girls disguised in fairies^③. He died in Guileford, on 14 February 1896 of influenza. He was 65.


